for early childhood learning. Thank you Jim and congratulations on receiving this honor.

April was the month the Nominating Committee put forth the recommendations for next year's officers and board members. May 6, 2011 we will vote for the new officers and board members. Please make an extra effort to be at the meeting and vote.

Our busy club continues with its projects raising money for the children of Brunswick County. Bridge for Scholarships had 70 card players and the event earned \$1,300. Congratulations to **Scott Baldwin** and his committee. We have just completed a successful Spring Festival selling plants and hot dogs. Kiwanians spent hundreds of hours setting up and taking down the festival. While the final dollars have not been calculated we believe that the budgeted dollars will be there. The 5K walk/race was well attended with over 200 runners.

Denny Marcin reports that the Kiwanis Golf Outing is planned for June 25, 2011. Member volunteers are out contacting former and prospective sponsors. Let's all get involved and help make this fund raiser a success.

Terrific Kids have a reading program at Southport Elementary School. Children who read 100 books this year will be invited to an ice cream social. Our board approved funding for the event.

Meals on Wheels continue without reimbursement to Kiwanis drivers for their mileage. Meals on Wheels will conclude their fiscal year this June and we are looking forward to getting back on the mileage payment for miles driven. The reduced rate of 19 cents will earn the club about \$600 a month. This will enable the club to make this year's budget.

Barry Ryan and his scholarship committee have conducted numerous interviews. Two interviews were completed April 19, 2011 for Teen Court and one interview completed April 29th with Early College High School. Additional interviews are being conducted for North Brunswick, South Brunswick, and Brunswick Academy scholarships in the first two weeks of May.

From that starting point, we have drafted a set of Club-specific strategic goals, objectives and guiding principles and we have matched all of our on-going programs against this set of guidelines.

-- The next step is to present all of this to the Board of Directors at the May meeting and, once the Board has had the opportunity to discuss and act on all this information, to present it to the entire membership at one of our regular meetings, hopefully in June.

The Festival has received good publicity and is "good to go". At present, plant sales are \$8,500 which is \$2,300 over cost. More volunteers are needed. Costs have been covered for the 5K Run.

Strategic Planning

The third meeting of the Strategic Planning Committee will be held on Thursday, April 28 at 9:00 am at the St. James Community Center. Discussion has been about the following: MOW changes, mission statement and goals, how to align our programs to get the most "bang for the buck", are we meeting needs of our target community and the need to identify unmet needs. With growth in Brunswick County increasing in the over 45 age group and declining in the under 18 age group, Club size is an issue that will be addressed.

Jim Nelson presented information regarding the reading program sponsored by Terrific Kids at Southport Elementary School. Funding is needed for an ice cream social for those who read 100 books. Permission was granted to proceed to research the details.

2012 Raffle

Joe Crostic presented three different scenarios for doing a raffle selling 300 to 500 tickets with 50 percent of cash being paid out to 18 to 35 winning ticket holders. The number of tickets sold would be limited to 300 or 500. Two scenarios presented had ticket prices at \$50 for 300 or 500 tickets sold. One scenario had ticket prices at \$100 for 300 tickets sold. The monies raised from this could replace some of the monies not received because of the reduced reimbursement from Meals on Wheels.

After a brief discussion, it was the consensus of the BOD that we would continue to fund the picnic from the Administration account this year and look at the subject again next year.
