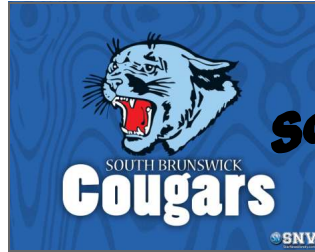

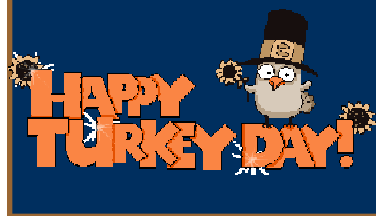
Barry Bey started the aquaculture program at South Brunswick High School in 1987, raising fish in a ditch on the school grounds. The program now has 18 aquariums, four ponds, a reservoir and a designated classroom. In 2006, Bey and his students worked with state agencies to help restock overfished southern flounder in North Carolina waters. After much research and intensive work, they released 841 flounder into Oak Island's Davis Canal, becoming a state model for flounder stock enhancement. Through these hands-on experiences, Bey teaches his students the importance of science, environmental awareness, responsibility, citizenship and service to the community.

## History of Daylight Saving Time

Daylight Saving Time was instituted in the United States during World War I in order to save energy for war production by taking advantage of the later hours of daylight between April and October. During World War II the federal government again required the states to observe the time change. Between the wars and after World War II, states and communities chose whether or not to observe Daylight Saving Time. In 1966, Congress passed the Uniform Time Act, which standardized the length of Daylight Saving Time.

Daylight Saving Time is four weeks longer since 2007 due to the passage of the Energy Policy Act in 2005. The Act extended Daylight Saving Time by four weeks from the second Sunday of March to the first Sunday of November, with the hope that it would save 10,000 barrels of oil each day through reduced use of power by businesses during daylight hours. Unfortunately, it is exceedingly difficult to determine energy savings from Daylight Saving Time and based on a variety of factors, it is possible that little or no energy is saved by Daylight Saving Time.

## New Member Procedures

1. Invite the prospective member to attend a regular meeting as a guest.
2. If the prospective member shows interest, the sponsor should invite him or her to a second meeting and give the prospective member a Membership Packet which includes:
  - *Changing Tomorrows Today* (includes membership information and application form)
  - Club Background Check Authorization Form
  - Program and Activities Booklet
  - Fact Sheet about the Southport-Oak Island Kiwanis Club
  - Letter to Prospective Member from the Club President
3. The Sponsor should receive the completed application materials and \$25 fee, add his or her personal endorsement to the package, and provide the completed application and endorsement to the Membership Committee Chairman.
4. The Membership Committee Chairman will request the Club Secretary to perform a background check for the prospective member.
5. Members of the Membership Committee and the Sponsor should meet with the prospective member during the application approval process and discuss the history and objectives of Kiwanis; the Club's service projects and fundraising activities, and the responsibilities, costs and benefits of club membership.
6. Once the background check has been completed and the prospective member has met with the Membership Committee, the Committee will review the application package and submit its recommendation for action to the Board of Directors.
7. The Board of Directors will vote to accept or decline the application for membership (Note: A 2/3 vote of the Board is required for acceptance.)
8. After the vote by the Board of Directors, the Club Secretary will notify the New Member and his or her Sponsor of the Board's action.
9. The President or Secretary will consult with the New Member and the Sponsor and set the date of the induction of the New Member.
10. Prior to induction, the Secretary shall:
  - Prepare a Membership Certificate
  - Prepare name badges
11. After induction, the Secretary shall:
  - Enter New Member information into the Kiwanis International membership database and send/mail a dues invoice to the Club Treasurer.
