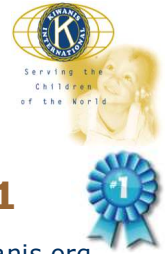

Budgets – **Bill Spellman** provided a Preliminary 2011-2012 Budget. The 2011-2012 Budget will be presented for approval at the October BOD meeting.

The need for volunteers to staff the computer lab at Brunswick Community College was presented by Mike Munson. A request for volunteers will be presented at the next membership meeting. Mike Munson will coordinate this program.

2011 Carolinas District Kiwanis Conference

Asheville, NC – 8/26-8/28/2011



Over 400 Kiwanis club members attended this year's Carolinas District Conference held in Asheville, NC. **Greg and Peg McDonald** participated and represented the Southport-Oak Island Kiwanis Club as the club's delegates to the business meetings and voting sessions. Both also attended the Friday half day CLO (Club Leadership Orientation) session that hosted approximately 90 Kiwanians. This program is required for incoming club officers.

Friday night's business meetings included division caucuses. Jake Hunt was voted in as Lt. Governor and Charlie Bowie was voted in for Lt. Governor-Designate for Division 26, our club's division. Saturday

morning the House of Delegates met and voted on various proposals and by-laws amendments. There were 182 club delegates and 56 at-large delegates representing 84 clubs in attendance and voting. The main proposal voted on was for a \$10 increase in member dues in the coming year. There were a number of individuals who raised well-thought out questions requesting the rationale for this increase and District officials acknowledged that the 50 percent increase will go to support administrative expenses. At the direction of our club's Board of Directors, **Greg and Peg McDonald** voted against the dues increase, as did about 30 other delegates, but the motion passed.

Doug Day, Chapel Hill, Carrboro was voted in as the new District Governor and Tom Currier, Greenville Eastside was voted in as the new District Governor-Designate. There were two 45-minute breakout sessions on Saturday morning as well.

Greg McDonald represented **John Sherrill** on a panel of the 4 club newsletters that provided information to those in attendance on how they create their newsletter providing various tips to those interested. **John Sherrill** and the CoastLiner won first place for the second year in a row as the outstanding newsletter in the District.
