TEEN COURT will resume in September with the first session on Tuesday, September 27.

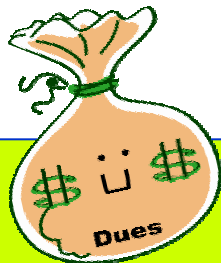

Board Notes for July 14, 2011

We have a signed contract for the MOW program to pay our Club a monthly fee of \$650. However, concern was expressed that a "fee-for-service" contract that stipulates payment directly to the Club might affect our non-profit tax status.

A motion to NOT SUPPORT the Carolinas District dues increase proposal at the August convention was APPROVED.

Gregg McDonald and **Peg McDonald** were elected delegates to the August 26-28, 2011, District Convention in Ashville, N. C.

Scott Baldwin presented a plan to develop a Diamond Level Sponsorship (\$1,000) to provide funding for Kiwanis Club programs serving the children of Brunswick County. Aspects of the plan are:

President **Mike Clune** announced that a replacement for **Fred Baker** is needed as a chair person for the Peer Court program for next year. Also needed is someone to manage the tutoring program. A blast email will be sent to the membership to find out who is currently a volunteer in this program.

A motion to buy box lunches i/a/o \$200 from BSRI and donate them to Matthew's Ministry was APPROVED. Matthew's Ministry is a food pantry dedicated to providing nourishing meals to children on weekends and holidays as well as summer vacations when children do not get meals at school.

President **Clune** announced that **Gina Cecil** has volunteered to attend a First Books informational meeting sponsored by the Brunswick County Health Department.

Board Notes for August 11, 2011

Scott Baldwin reported Groceries Raffle sales to date of approximately \$7,000. Nearly 50 percent of the expected returns have been achieved with aggressive outside sales.

Big Buddy Program of Brunswick County - Chuck Signore, facilitator for the Big Buddy Program, presented the following regarding the children and the volunteers:

- Goal is to develop positive behaviors and to instill the value of education.
- Goals can be achieved through enhanced interaction with a child.
- Academics are stressed to improve school grades.
- Rewards are earned by improvements made by the child..
- Child's behavior is monitored and reported to the Cape Fear Volunteer Center in Wilmington.
- Parent(s) register the child giving the program access to the child's school record. There has been some reluctance regarding this access due to privacy issues.
- Volunteers must commit to one year with 2 hours per week minimum.

Background checks, personal recommendations and drivers' licenses are required of volunteers.

Diamond-level Sponsors - A minimum of \$1,000 is required for a diamond-level sponsorship. The target for the 2011-2012 year is to acquire 6 sponsors. **Scott Baldwin** has developed a plan with various categories or channels in which a sponsor would have exclusivity rights.

Tutoring - **Joe Day** has been appointed chair person for the tutoring program. Those persons who participate in the tutoring program have been identified with efforts continuing to determine what subjects are involved and where the tutoring occurs.

Budgets – **Bill Spellman** provided a year-to-date report on all service projects and fundraising activities. All chair persons will be requested to submit budgets for the 2011-2012 club year.

A request for a \$200 cash donation to fund the purchase of school supplies for Bolivia Elementary School was APPROVED contingent upon clarification of how the \$200 becomes school supplies in the hands of students.
